To provide young people and young adults with the best targeted support as they enter vocational training and the workplace.

CMBB

Case Management Vocational Education and Training (Case Management Berufsbildung, CMBB) is for young adults aged 14–25 who face a number of challenges. They are given individual support to help them to make successful career choices and enter basic vocational training or working life.

IV Canton of Bern

IV Canton of Bern is a social insurance office that helps people with health impairments.

New prospects

Case Management Vocational Education and Training (CMBB) and IV Canton of Bern have been working together closely since 1 January 2022 to best support young people and young adults aged 14–25 who have health problems and face other challenges with respect to entering the workforce.

As a result, opportunities are now available to attend various bridging programs with additional individual support measures. Examples of such support measures include:

New types of support

- Provision of application dossier
- Application techniques
- Coaching for teaching staff
- Coaching for students
- Support with transitioning from primary school to a bridging opportunity
- Support with transitioning from the bridging opportunity to an apprenticeship
- (Pre-)apprenticeship placement or internship
- Practice test
- Learning and working techniques
- Learning therapy
- Tutoring
- Getting ready to search for an apprenticeship
- Support with special educational needs
- Unconventional support measures (tailored)

Contact person

The main contact person for bridging opportunities is the responsible case manager. The case manager ensures smooth cooperation with IV Canton of Bern and anyone who provides support, whether at school, at work, with additional support measures or with the family.
